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## **STUDENTS ENGAGEMENT IN COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER IN AMA CHATASALI**

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Since the upper primary students have exams ahead, keeping the exams in mind, only upper primary students are taught in the morning. But in the evening, primary, upper primary, and dropout students come and join in the “Ama Chatasali”.

### **Story Telling:**

To instill self-confidence in children through storytelling. To shape their behavior and build their personality, we give them various story books to read. We tell them various stories and also encourage them to tell stories.



### **Extra Curriculum:**

Children are given special education by focusing on their inherent talents in various areas. Such as dance, singing, drawing, craft, coloring, clay art.




## **School Observation:**

Once every two weeks, Anweshana volunteers visit schools, take feedback from school teachers about the progress made in the learning, behavior and regularity of admitted dropout children.



## **Volunteers Counseling:**

We hold volunteer meetings every Sunday. Volunteer attendance, children's course completion reports, and various challenges faced by the volunteers, center and community are discussed.



## **Parents Meeting:**

We hold parents meeting every month on "Sankranti". Various problems of children like education, behavior, cleanliness, various interests and bad habits and also problems of their family are discussed. Mobile addiction of children was discussed this time. Most of the children spend more time with mobile than their studies. Due to this, they are losing interest in education. How to keep them away from it was discussed.



## **Student Counseling:**

All the students of Chatshali are provided counseling once every 15 days of the month. The children's education and other issues are discussed. We review their education by looking at their exam reports and course



coverage reports. A lot of advice is also given regarding their behaviour.

### New Year 2025:

## **TRAINING AND WORKSHOP**

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### **Nature Friendly(Panchagabya):**

Children are trained to prepare environmentally friendly Panchagabya products to make them self-reliant along with free education. People throw away cow dung and urine, thinking it useless. We prepare Panchagabya products by mixing some milk, ghee, curd in that cow dung and urine. Such as Diyas, Rakshis, various idols, and household items.



Since these are made from the five elements of the cow, they are environmentally friendly. They quickly get mixed into the soil after use. As a result, the amount of waste is also reduced, Panchagabya enables us to earn money and protects the environment, increases the fertility

of the soil. Forests and cows are also protected. By preparing Panchagabya, children become economically viable and become aware of the protection of the environment, and thereby fulfill their responsibility as nature friends.

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
